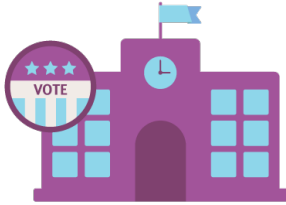

Public policy and advocacy.



STCU advocates on behalf of our members and communities. We're a longtime supporter of school bonds and levies, and a leader in legislative advocacy on behalf of credit unions.

In 2025, in response to Washington Senate Bill 5794, STCU swiftly mobilized staff and members to lead a coordinated legislative effort, successfully defending the member-owned, not-for-profit structure of credit unions and preserving our ability to serve members and invest in our community.

STCU was a finalist for the GoWest Credit Union Association's Community Impact Award for our FAFSA assistance program.

With the opening of our first Oregon branches in 2025, STCU began building relationships with legislators, and advocating for key regional efforts. Activities included participating in the Eastern Oregon Economic Summit in Pendleton and the GoWest Credit Union Day at the Capitol in Salem.

STCU hosted two Frank Talks events, designed to spark meaningful conversation on the issues shaping our region's business landscape. Experts from the Association of Washington Business shared legislative updates, including recent changes to employment law, taxation, and the regulatory environment.
